Separation from Injury,	Injury,	We recommend discussing this with your students prior to your visit.	If a student is unaccounted for, the teachers must notify the head teacher who will organise an initial search of the immediate area.
group, getting lost	bup, getting threatening t circumstance	If feeling threatened by another person, students should walk away and seek assistance from Wellington Hockey staff.	If not found, the head teacher will notify Wellington Hockey staff who will conduct a thorough search according to the lost children policy. 		Any student leaving the main group for any reason must advise the teacher and be accompanied by an adult appointed by the school.

An assessment will be made and an incident report may be completed for a 'near miss' or 'unsafe act'. For minor accidents your tour teacher must be notified who will in turn notify Wellington Hockey staff. All incidents involving vehicles must be reported to your teacher or Wellington Hockey immediately, whether resulting in injury or not. An assessment will be made and an incident report may be completed for a 'near miss' or 'unsafe act'.
		Vehicle lanes are clearly marked on roads and ramps and pedestrian lanes are clearly marked on the vehicle ramp. Strict 10km/hr (crawling speed) and directional limits are	For minor accidents your head teacher must be notified who will in turn notify Wellington Hockey staff.
